## **March 5 – Mark 10:32-35**

In verses 35-44, James and John make a request of Jesus. They asked Jesus for something that he did not want. Should we be using prayer to be getting everything that WE want?

Who should our prayer be about?

## **March 6 – Mark 11:1-19**

*Reread Mark 11:2-6*

The two disciples did exactly what Jesus wanted them to do. They didn't change anything that he asked them to do. When do you find yourself being tempted to sin?

Think of a time that you maybe didn't do what God exactly asked of you to do, even though you it was wrong.

What can you change to be more obedient in the future?

## **March 7 – Mark 11:20-33**

*Reread Mark 11:24*

It is very easy for us to pray and expect God to do what we ask immediately. Why is it important to have patience when it comes to prayer?

## **March 8 – Mark 12:1-27**

*Reread Mark 12:25-27*

It is so cool to see how Jesus references the Old Testament here. This conversation happened because they didn't truly understand the Scriptures they had been taught.

What is one thing that you have learned so far in this year's DBR?

What is one thing that you do not understand?

## **March 9 – Mark 12:28-44**

*Reread Mark 12:29-31*

Jesus gives us two commandments: 1) Love the Lord with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength. 2) Love your neighbor as yourself. These are things most of us hear growing up, and we know we should keep these commandments, but it's hard to do this all the time! When do you find it hard to honor God and show love for him above everything else in your life?

Who do you find hard to show love toward? What can you do to change that this week?

## **March 10 – Mark 13:1-13**

*Reread Mark 13:10*

Jesus tells us to be sharing the gospel with all the nations. When and where are can you share the good news? Who will you share it with this week?

## **March 11 -- Mark 13:14-37**

*Reread Mark 13:32-33*

Jesus says here that we need to be on guard because no one knows the day or the hour of when He returns.

What do you need to do to be more "on guard"? (think about what the servants should have been doing instead of falling asleep).

## **March 12 -- Mark 14:1-25**

Judas sinned big! He betrayed the Son of God, but we sin each day as well. Jesus commands us in Matthew 5:48 to be perfect, just like God. In order to do this, we need to be turning from our sin and trusting in Christ. We know that we cannot be completely perfect until we are in heaven, but we can do our best to be more and more obedient.

What specific sin(s) do you need to turn away from?


What are places and things that lead you into the temptation to sin?

## **March 13 -- Mark 14:26-50**

*Reread Mark 14:36*

Prayer is something that God has graciously given to us so that we can be a part of what he is doing on Earth and in our lives. We are called to pray for things that go along with what God wants. Have you ever found yourself praying for a something that you really want? (Like a good grade on a test or a big win for your sports team or the latest toy or gadget etc.)

What should you be praying for?



### **March 14 -- Mark 14:51-72**

*Reread Mark 14:67-68*

Peter denied knowing Jesus. And as we grow older, people start disliking Christians more and more. Do you ever find yourself ashamed to talk about God or going to church?

Why should you not be ashamed?

### **March 15 -- Mark 15:1-26**

Jesus was tortured when he didn't deserve it. He took our place and was punished for our sin. Obviously, we should be grateful for this.

Have you ever found yourself thinking less of this than you should? Is the good news, old news to you?

What can you do to change that way of thinking?

### **March 16 -- Mark 15:27-47**

How are you going to show your gratitude for Jesus dying for you?

How often do you think you should? How often do YOU thank God for it?

### **March 17 -- Mark 16**

*Reread Mark 16:15*

We see almost the same message as in Mark 13:10. Knowing that you need to tell people about Jesus, who are you going to tell? Think about people in your class, sports team, or in your neighborhood. Write down 5 names.
